Welcome

On behalf of the Baruch College community, we would like to welcome you to the **Fourth Annual CUNY-Wide General Education Conference, “Making It Work and Making It Matter.”** This year’s conference has much to live up to after the successful conferences hosted by our colleagues at LaGuardia Community College, Queensborough Community College, and Queens College. We hope to stimulate thought and discussion today that all of us can reflect and act upon in the months to come. Any success we achieve we will owe, in no small part, to what we have learned from the previous conferences and to suggestions from our colleagues at Queens College.

We present a rich program that owes much to the continuing conversation that has flourished through initiatives sponsored by the CUNY Office of Undergraduate Education: CUE, CASTL, WAC/WID, and General Education. Opportunities to converse with colleagues from across the university about issues of shared concern (pedagogy and faculty development, to cite just two) were few until recently. The annual conference provides a Beethovenian coda to the year’s discussions, with echoes that resound into the next year.

As Dr. Johnson might have predicted, knowing that we had to organize this conference concentrated Baruch’s Gen Ed efforts wonderfully. This year has seen some important breakthroughs at Baruch. Faculty task forces on first-year writing and on quantitative skills pedagogy have forged substantive recommendations regarding these crucial elements of Tier I of our three-tiered core curriculum. Learning goals of Tier II have been completed and we have assessed several of them. This year also saw redesign of the largest component of Tier III—our Psychology minor draws more than one quarter of Baruch undergraduates—and implementation of its new communication-intensive capstone. Most broadly, we have begun to address how we present Gen Ed to our students. Your conference materials include a draft of our new Gen Ed brochure; our CUE proposal will include creating a website based on the design sketched therein.

Once again, welcome to Baruch College. We hope you enjoy today’s installment in the ongoing conversation.

LOUIS MENAND is Anne T. and Robert M. Bass Professor of English and American Literature and Language at Harvard. His book *The Metaphysical Club* (Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2001) won the **Pulitzer Prize for History**, the **Francis Parkman Prize** from the Society of American Historians, and the **Heartland Prize** for Nonfiction from the *Chicago Tribune*, and was named one of the nine best books of 2001 by the editors of the *New York Times Book Review*. He is also the author of *American Studies* (Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2002) and *Discovering Modernism: T. S. Eliot and His Context* (Oxford University Press, 1987; 2d edition 2007), and is the editor or co-editor of books on American thought, literary criticism, and higher education. He was associate editor of *The New Republic* from 1986-1987 and contributing editor of *The New York Review of Books* from 1994-2001. He has been a contributor to *The New Yorker* since 1991; since 2001, he has been a staff writer there, and has been named a National Magazine Award Finalist four times.
